

Fabric Requirements

One panel (36") Panel-CD3100 White 3 yards Hue-C5141 White 21/8 yards Redwork-CD2357 Scarlet 3/4 yard Dot-CD3105 White 15/8 yards Redwork-CD3102 Red 1/2 yard Redwork-CD3101 White 11/2 yards Redwork-CD3102 White 13/4 yards Redwork-CD3101 Red 1/3 yard Redwork-CD5141 Red 83/4 yards backing fabric of your choice 105" × 105" batting

Cutting

Label the pieces with their alpha-numeric designator as they're cut.

From Panel-CD3100 White:

• Cut nine 9¹/₂" squares (**A1**), centering a motif in each square. Note: You can embroider the panel motifs, or leave them as printed blocks. If you plan to embroider, cut the squares larger than 9¹/₂" and trim to 9¹/₂" square after completing embroidery.

From Hue-C5141 White:

- Cut three $9^{1/2}$ " × width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut forty-eight 2" × $9^{1/2}$ " strips (**B1**).
- Cut two 5³/₈" × WOF strips. Sub-cut eight 5³/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (**B2**). Trim remainder of second strip to 3¹/₈" wide. Sub-cut eight 3¹/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (**B3**).
- Cut four 3⁷/₈" × WOF strips. Sub-cut forty 3⁷/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield eighty triangles (**B4**).
- Cut fourteen 2" × WOF strips. From one strip, sub-cut twenty 2" (**B5**) squares. Set the remaining strips aside for strip piecing.
- Cut nine $2^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips for inner borders.

From Redwork-CD2357 Scarlet:

- Cut one $9^{1/2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut twenty $9^{1/2}$ " x 2" strips (**C1**).
- Cut one 5⁷/₈" × WOF strip. Sub-cut four 5⁷/₈" squares and cut each square twice diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (C2).
- Cut one 31/8" × WOF strip. Sub-cut eight 31/8" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (**C3**).
- Cut sixteen 2" × WOF strips. From three strips, sub-cut forty-eight 2" squares (**C4**). Set aside the remaining strips for strip piecing.
- Cut ten 2¹/₂" × WOF strips for binding.

From Dot-CD3105 White:

- Cut three 7¹/₄" × WOF strips. Sub-cut twelve 7¹/₄" squares and cut each square twice diagonally to yield forty-eight triangles (**D1**).
- Cut one 31/8" × WOF fabric strip. Sub-cut eight 31/8" squares and cut each square once diagonally to make sixteen triangles (**D2**).
- Cut five 3⁷/₈" × WOF strips. Sub-cut forty-eight 3⁷/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield ninety-six triangles (**D3**).

From Redwork-CD3102 Red:

- Cut five 4¹/₄" × WOF strips. Sub-cut forty 4¹/₄" squares and cut each square twice diagonally to yield (160) triangles (**E1**).
- Cut five 3⁷/₈" × WOD strips. Sub-cut forty 3⁷/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield ninety-six triangles (**E2**).
- Cut six $2^5/8^{"} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty $2^5/8^{"}$ squares (**E3**).

From Redwork-CD3101 White:

• Cut two $6^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips. Sub-cut twelve $6^{1/2}$ " squares (**F1**).

From Redwork-CD3102 White:

- Cut two 5³/₈" × WOF strips. Sub-cut eight 5³/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (**G1**).
- Cut nine 4¹/₄" × WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 4¹/₄" squares and cut each square twice diagonally to yield (320) triangles (G2).



From Redwork-CD3101 Red:

- Cut four $4^{3}/4^{"} \times WOF$ strips. Sub-cut twenty $4^{3}/4^{"}$ squares (**H1**).
- Cut ten $4^{1/2}$ " × WOF strips for outer borders.

From Redwork-CD5141 Red:

- Cut one 5⁷/₈" × WOF strip. Sub-cut four 5⁷/₈" squares and cut each square twice diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (11).
- Cut one 3¹/₈" × WOF strip. Sub-cut eight 3¹/₈" squares and cut each square once diagonally to yield sixteen triangles (**12**).


Block Construction

All seam allowances are ¹/₄" and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press after each addition during block construction.

Center Block

Select one A1 square, four B5 squares and four C1 strips. Sew a C1 strip to each side of the A1 square. Sew a B5 square to each end of remaining C1 strips. Sew a pieced unit to the top and the other to the bottom. Make one center block (figure 1).




Center Block Make 1.

Embroidery Blocks

2. Sew a **B1** strip to each side of an **A1** square and press. Sew a **C4** square to each end of two **B1** strips. Sew pieced unit to top and bottom of block and press (*figure 2*). Repeat with the remaining seven **A1** squares.




Embroidery Block Make 8.

Framed Pinwheel Blocks

3. Sew a **B3** triangle to an 12 triangle along the short side. Sew an I1 triangle to the bottom of the unit and press. Make a total of four units. Sew four pieced units together to complete a pinwheel block. Sew a **G1** triangle on each side of the pinwheel block. Make a total of four pinwheel units








Pinwheel unit Make 4.

4. Sew a **D2** triangle to a C3 triangle along the short side. Sew a C2 triangle to the bottom of unit. Make a total of four units. Sew four pieced units together to complete a pinwheel block. Sew a **B2** triangle on each side of the pinwheel block. Make a total of four pinwheel units (figure 4).







Pinwheel unit Make 4.

 Using the same method as the center block, add a frame to each pinwheel unit as shown in Figure 5.
Make four of each Framed Pinwheel Corner and Framed Pinwheel Center blocks.

Square-in-a-square Blocks

6. Sew a **B4** triangle to each side of an **H1** square. Make a total of twenty units (*figure 6*).


7. Sew an **E1** triangle to a **G2** triangle along the short side. Make a total of (160) units. Sew a **G2** triangle to each side of an **E3** square, noting the orientation. Sew an **E1/G2** unit to each side of the **G2/E3** unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of eighty units (*figure 7*).








8. Sew a $2" \times WOF$ C5141 White strip to a $2" \times WOF$ CD2357 Scarlet strip and press toward the Scarlet. Make a total of eight strip sets. From each strip set, cross-cut twenty 2" segments. Alternating colors, sew two segments together to make a four-patch. Repeat to make a total of eighty four-patch units (figure 8).




Cut (20) 2"-wide segments from each.



9. Arrange the pieced units, as shown in Figure 9. Sew the units together in each row. Sew the rows together to complete the block. Make a total of twenty Square-in-a-square blocks.


Square-in-a-square Block Make 20.

Star Blocks

10. Sew a 2" × WOF C5141 White strip to a 2" × WOF CD2357 Scarlet strip and press toward the Scarlet. Make a total of five strip sets. From each strip set, cross-cut twenty 2" segments. Alternating colors, sew two segments together to make a four-patch. Repeat to make a total of forty-eight four-patch units (figure 10).

Cut (20) 2"-wide segments from each.



11. Sew together one **D1** triangle and two **E2** triangles following Figure 11 to make a flying-geese unit. Trim to $3^{1/2}$ " × $6^{1/2}$ " if needed. Make a total of forty-eight flying-geese units.






Flying-geese unit Make 48.

12. Arrange the four-patch and flying-geese units and an **F1** square as shown in Figure 12. Sew the units together into horizontal rows. Sew the rows together to complete the block. Make a total of twelve Star blocks.

Finishing

- 16. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing, and quilt as desired.
- 17. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
- 18. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.

Quilt Top Assembly

- 13. Following the quilt photo, lay out the blocks in seven rows of seven squares each. Matching adjacent seams, sew the blocks together in each row, then sew the rows together in order.
- 14. Sew $2^{1}/2^{11} \times WOF$ C5141 White strips together end to end. Cut two $2^{1}/2^{11} \times 84^{1}/2^{11}$ strips and sew one to each side of the quilt center. Cut two $2^{1}/2^{11} \times 88^{1}/2^{11}$ strips and sew one to the top and the other to the bottom of quilt center.
- 15. Sew $4^{1}/2^{11} \times WOF$ CD3101 Red strips together end to end. Cut two $4^{1}/2^{11} \times 88^{1}/2^{11}$ strips and sew one to each side of quilt center. Cut two $4^{1}/2^{11} \times 96^{1}/2^{11}$ strips and sew one to the top and the other to the bottom of quilt center.

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
